SUBJECT: Approval of Proposed Water & Sewer Rate Resolutions for 2007-2008

SUBMITTING DEPARTMENT: Finance

CITY MANAGER APPROVAL:

The City of Novi purchases treated water and sewer services from outside sources. The attached rate schedules incorporate the pass-through increase amount from Detroit Water & Sewerage Department (7.823%) for water, and an increase of 4% from the prior year on the Oakland County Drain rate for the metered Huron Rouge Sewage Disposal System (no increase from OCDC for 2007-8) for the services provided by the City of Novi Water & Sewer System (i.e. sewer transmission maintenance, lift station maintenance, etc.). The water and sewer rate increase to the customer for the 2007-8 fiscal year will range from approximately 6.1%-7.8%. We are recommending if there are any "look-back" sewer charge adjustments from the Detroit Water & Sewerage Department that this would be absorbed by the Water & Sewer Fund the same as was done in the prior years. The water equipment rates, inspection fees and miscellaneous charges have been adjusted based on our contract for water connection fees and the current cost of our equipment (a 15% administrative fee has been added to the cost).

It is important to note that the City of Novi Water & Sewer Fund, the Oakland County Drain Commission and the Detroit Water & Sewer Department (DWSD) are all not-for-profit entities. However, the American Water Works Association (AWWA) recommends government agencies be prudent in the computations of reserves, either through depreciation or through a future debt service reserve.

The City's rate policy has been computed to cover current costs including approximately 25% of depreciation. The City's Water & Sewer Fund is now able to include a portion of the depreciation as a result of the decrease in debt service. Bonds were paid off through the capital charges collected in the prior year. The interest expense in 2004-5 was \$779,900 and for 2007-8 is estimated \$79,900.

### RESOLUTION WATER RATES

WHEREAS, the City of Novi through the Code of Ordinance, Section 34 has empowered itself to acquire, construct, and operate a water supply system; and,

WHEREAS, by Section 34-19 the City of Novi may establish rates to operate said system; and,

WHEREAS, certain rates must reflect actual costs of providing services and materials; and,

WHEREAS, the cost to finance said system demonstrates a need to increase the water rates.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the following rates shall be implemented as the rates of the Water Supply System pursuant to Section 34-19 for all bills rendered after August 1, 2007.

#### **WATER TAP FEES**

For the privilege of tapping into the Water Supply System, there shall be a charge of One Thousand One Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$1,850.00), multiplied by the unit factor set forth in the Unit Factor Chart as adopted by the City Council. With the exception of those users served directly by the water main constructed and financed by Special Assessment District Number 126 who will be charged Five Hundred Dollars (\$ 500.00) multiplied by the factor set forth in the Unit Factor Chart.

#### **SPECIAL RATES**

For miscellaneous services for which, in the judgment of the City Council a special rate should be established, such rates shall be established and charged in accordance with the schedule of rates adopted by resolution of the City Council.

#### **RESOLUTION**

#### **Huron-Rouge Sewer Rates**

WHEREAS, the City of Novi through the Code of Ordinance, Section 34-145 has established that the rates established are to be sufficient to provide for the payment of the expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for the maintenance of the system as are necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order, to provide for the payment of the sewage disposal charge required to be paid to the county, to provide for the payment of the annual payments required to be made to the county in connection with the Huron-Rouge System, to provide for the payment and interest as required by the contract with the county, and to provide for the payment of such other expenditures and funds for the system as this division may require. Such rates shall be fixed and revised from time to time as may be necessary to produce these amounts.

**WHEREAS**, Oakland County has notified the City of Novi that their charge to us for sewage disposal has been increased for 2007-2008,

WHEREAS, the cost to finance said system demonstrates that the sewer rates will be increasing,

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the following rates shall be implemented as the rates of the sewer system pursuant to Section 34-145 for all bills rendered after August 1, 2007.

#### **BASE SEWER RATES**

\$2.32 per thousand gallons for metered consumption, and \$77.00 per quarter/per tap unit for un-metered consumption

#### **INSPECTION FEE**

Sewer Inspection Fee.....\$90.00

#### High Strength Pollutants (HSP) and for Industrial Waste Control (IWC)

**WHEREAS**, the pass-through surcharges from the Detroit Water and Sewer Department for High Strength Pollutants (HSP) and for Industrial Waste Control (IWC) which are regulated by the Clean Water Act and may change every year.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the City of Novi will collect the HSP and IWC as determined by the Detroit Water and Sewer Department.

#### **Novi-Walled Lake Sewer System**

**WHEREAS**, the Oakland County Drain Commission (OCDC) operates the Novi-Walled Lake Treatment Plant for the Cities of Novi and Walled Lake; and

WHEREAS, certain rates must reflect actual costs of providing services.

#### **USAGE FEE**

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the new rate to the user of this system is established at \$67.56 per unit per quarter for all bills rendered after August 1, 2007.

#### **SEWER INSPECTION FEE**

WHEREAS, OCDC operates and maintains the Novi-Walled Lake Treatment Plant, and all sewer infrastructure for effluent to the plant.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the City of Novi will collect the pass-through OCDC sewer inspection fee as determined by the OCDC.

#### **INDUSTRIAL PRETREATMENT PROGRAM (IPP)**

**WHEREAS**, the pass-through IPP surcharges from OCDC are regulated by the Clean Air Act and change every year.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the City of Novi will collect the IPP surcharge as determined by the OCDC.



The external audit activities for FY 2005/06 are still in progress. Calculation of the FY 2005/06 Sewage Look-Back Adjustment will be the final step in the process. Once this is complete, the appropriate total net credit or debit adjustment will be prorated over a 12-month period. The Department will submit the net Look-Back adjustment schedule to each community in a separate mailing. The adjustment will be applied equally on each regular service bill rendered by the Department commencing August 1, 2007, and ending July 1, 2008.

Dear Mr. Pearson:

Notification was received from the Wayne County Department of Public Services informing us that Wayne County has revised their Schedule of Rates and Charges for the Huron-Rouge Sewage Disposal System effective July 1, 2007.

Wayne County's sewage disposal charge will increase to \$9.80 per 1,000 cubic feet while decreasing the costs of fixed and excess flow charges from the current rate of \$1.67 per MCF to \$1.50 per MCF.

We are recommending effective July 1, 2007, to continue a Major Maintenance Reserve in the amount of \$1.08 per MCF, an increase of \$0.08 per MCF for the Huron-Rouge Sewage Disposal System. The reserve will fund major maintenance issues which may arise in the years ahead.

Oakland County's current Huron-Rouge Sewage Disposal System rate is \$13.23 MCF. We have reviewed the financial condition of the system and determined that the current rate will remain the same at \$13.23 per MCF, effective July 1, 2007.

# HURON-ROUGE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007

#### A. Wastewater Disposal Charge

#### Metered Water Consumption

Each community shall report within ten (10) days following the end of each calendar quarter the total equivalent master metered water consumption in the District served by the System. Where the master metered water consumption is not available, individual metered water consumption times 1.108 shall be equivalent to master metered water consumption.

Based on the quarterly report, each community shall pay \$13.23 per one thousand (1,000) cubic feet of equivalent master metered water consumption, as established by the County Agency.

#### Unmetered Water Consumption

Where metered water consumption is not available, then a consumption assigned by the County Agency shall be the equivalent master metered water consumption for each unit assigned to the user in accordance with the current Oakland County Drain Commissioner Schedule of Unit Assignment Factors, with a minimum assignment of one (1) unit for each connection.

The unit charge per quarter will be \$66.15 per unit effective July 1, 2007.

#### B. Penalty

The said sewage disposal service charge shall be payable quarterly. If any municipality does not pay its' service charge on the date when the same becomes due, then there shall be added to such charge a penalty of one (1) percent for each month or fraction thereof for which the same remains unpaid.


