SUBJECT: Consideration of a request from Whitehall Real Estate, Minasian Development Corporation, The Hooberman Company, and Walsh College to participate in a cost sharing agreement to complete design engineering for the signalization of the Meadowbrook Road/Eleven Mile Road intersection.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The need for a traffic signal at the intersection of Eleven Mile Road and Meadowbrook Road has been established and was included in the City's Capital Improvement Program for implementation in FY 2008/2009. Four businesses (Whitehall Real Estate, Minasian Development Corporation, The Hooberman Company, and Walsh College) that rely on this intersection for access to/egress from their sites have expressed a desire to have the intersection engineered now rather than waiting for the start of the next fiscal year (Rob Hayes' August 1, 2007 memorandum, attached). This request is premised on the assumption that Council will select this project for funding in FY 08/09.

In order to facilitate the start of design engineering work, the four businesses have offered to pay \$20,000 toward the estimated \$25,000 design fee. Consequently, two options for Council to consider are:

- 1. Appropriate the additional \$5,000 needed to complete the project design in 2007, and x subsequently approve funding in the FY 08/09 budget for project construction in 2008.
- Appropriate the additional \$5,000 needed to complete the project design in 2007, dedicate 2008 Tri-Party funding towards this project, subsequently approve funding in the FY 08/09 budget for project construction in 2008, and reimburse the \$20,000 design contribution from Tri-Party funds.


The main advantage of proceeding with design engineering now is that the intersection would be designed and ready for construction when the new fiscal year begins in July 2008. The primary disadvantage of making a commitment to design the project now would be the four parties' expectation that the City would be required to fund project construction in FY 08/09, and this commitment would be at the expense of other competing road projects. However, this can be addressed with option 1, by the City offering to participate with \$5,000 and obtaining an agreement from the property owners before proceeding. The agreement would spell out that the share from the property owners will <u>not</u> be reimbursed and will be considered a contribution to proceed with early engineering of the project.

If Council deems that participation in a cost sharing agreement with these business entities is in the City's best interest, Engineering staff will work with the City Attorney to develop an agreement that will be presented to Council at the next City Council meeting.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Consideration of a request from Whitehall Real Estate, Minasian Development Corporation, The Hooberman Company, and Walsh College to participate in a cost sharing agreement to complete the design engineering for the signalization of the Meadowbrook Road/Eleven Mile Road intersection.

Date:

The improvement of the Eleven Mile Road/Meadowbrook Road intersection is identified in the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) as a project to potentially be completed in FY 2008/2009. The scope of the project includes signalizing the intersection and widening the east leg to add a dedicated left turn lane for the southbound Meadowbrook turning movement. The total estimated cost of the project is approximately \$493,000, including possible right-of-way acquisition (see attached cost estimate and map abstracted from the FY07/08 CIP).

Recently the City has been approached by various Eleven/Meadowbrook area businesses that have expressed a desire for the City to make the intersection improvements early in FY 08/09 so that access management issues affecting their businesses may be mitigated as soon as possible (Gary) Jonna's July 17th e-mail message, attached). Collectively they are willing to commit \$20,000 of the estimated \$25,000 needed for design so that the project can be designed this year and constructed in 2008 (instead of the 2008 through 2009 design/construction schedule proposed in the CIP).

City Council may wish to accept this offer and either:

1. Appropriate the additional \$5,000 needed to complete the project design in 2007, and ** subsequently approve funding in the FY 08/09 budget for project construction in 2008.

2. Appropriate the additional \$5,000 needed to complete the project design in 2007, dedicate 2008 Tri-Party funding towards this project, subsequently approve funding in the FY 08/09 budget for project construction in 2008, and reimburse the \$20,000 design contribution from Tri-Party funds.

Approving either of these options would provide us with a completely scoped and designed project. Also, completing the design in advance of FY08/09 would determine whether additional right-of-way will have to be acquired to accommodate the new left turn lane.

As you know, a group of property owners in the vicinity of Eleven & Meadowbrook consisting of myself(Campus Park), Meadowbridge Park (Jim Hooberman), Ted Minasian and Walsh College (John Young) have banded together for the purpose of expediting the installation of a traffic signal at the foregoing intersection. It is our understanding from you that our commitment to fund the design of the signal in 2007 will accelerate the timeline for installation of the signal to the 2008 construction season. At this time, we can commit \$20,000 towards signal design predicated on the City's commitment to physically install the signal in 2008. Ii is our further understanding that in the event the City of Novi receives funding for 100% of the design and installation costs of the signal, we will be reimbursed for our design costs paid to the City.
