The Commission and the Department staff have been in agreement about the need to expand our outreach in the community to foster more support and awareness. The direction of the department and the profession is to develop a benefits-based message. This increases the recognition that parks and recreation are essential to the growth, health and prosperity of a community.

We have identified five benefits that Novi Parks programs and facilities provide that are easily communicated, documented and understood by the commission, staff and community. Our five primary benefits are:

- Promoting a Healthy, Active Lifestyle
- Enhancing Economic Development
- Stewards of the Environment

- Creating Safer Neighborhoods
- Instilling a Sense of Community

Attached are easy to follow pages explaining our contributions to the community. Much of the language used is directly from our 2007-2010 Strategic Plan, City Council goals, the Mayor's State of the City address and research documentation. # Promoting Healthy, Active Lifestyles

## The Benefits of Parks & Recreation in Novi



Michigan has adult obesity rates of 25.6 percent, ranking it the 11th heaviest in the nation. We also rank 13th in the nation for adult diabetes levels and 13th for rates of hypertension. This is epidemic also reaches to children. 12% of Michigan adolescents in grades 9-12 are considered obese.


Studies prove that regular physical activity has a benefit on the health and well being, both physical and mental, of community residents. In turn, the physical and mental benefits associated with these activities lead to cost savings in health care.

#### For Example:

- Each mile walked by a sedentary person would give him/her and extra 20 minutes of life
- Starting an activity program reduce the risk of dying in men compared to those who remained sedentary
- Moderate physical activity, on a regular basis, reduces the symptoms of mild or moderate depression and anxiety neuroses by improving self-image, social skills and mental health

By offering access to physical activity for residents through recreational programs the Novi Parks department provides health benefits to communities and residents.

In 2006, participation numbers for Novi Parks recreation programs were over 250,000. Our senior center alone has expanded its fitness offerings by 50% including Pilates, yoga and aqua exercise. Our programs and facilities played a large role in Novi receiving the Gold Promoting Active Communities Award from the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness. Novi is the only community in the state to achieve this recognition.



## **Enhancing Economic Development**

### The Benefits of Parks & Recreation on Novi



Economic Development is widely viewed as being central to a community's economic prosperity because it is viewed as a means of enhancing the tax base. Novi Parks, Recreation and Forestry contributes to Economic Development through:

#### Attracting Businesses with a Highly-Educated Workforce

In today's society, businesses are keen on retaining their talent and attracting more. In the intensely recruited high-technology, research and development field, decision makers rate quality of life as the most important determination to locate their business. No matter how quality of life is defined, park and recreation opportunities are a major component of it.

ITC Holdings Corporation saw that quality of life in Novi, therefore decided to locate their headquarter here. ITC demonstrated their commitment of enhancing Novi's quality of life by making a \$500,000 donation to the Novi Parks Foundation.


#### **Enhancing Real Estate Values**

Studies show people frequently pay more for homes located close to a park or natural area. The enhanced value of these properties results in the owners paying higher property taxes to governments.

Oakland County is experiencing continued residential growth and Novi is at the helm with 1 out of every 4 new Oakland County residents moving to Novi. An Oakland County study has shown that property adjacent to natural assets enjoys higher property values.

#### **Attracting Retirees**

It is estimated that by 2030, the number of people 65 years or older residing in Novi will increase by 269%, making up 18% of the population. Their decision where to locate with their substantial retirement incomes is primarily governed by two factors: climate and recreational opportunities. Retired household contribute a great deal to the community, studies indicate if 100 retired households come to a Novi in a year, each with a \$40,000 retirement income, their economic impact is similar to that of a new business spending \$4 million annually in the community.

## Stewards of the Environment

### The Benefits of Parks & Recreation in Novi



One of the roles of the Novi Parks Department is to be a champion for green infrastructure and advocate for green building and maintenance practices while educating the community on best practices.

#### Green Infrastructure

Linking parks, greenways, and other natural or restored lands together to create an interconnected green space system provides great benefits for people, wildlife and the economy. It helps connect people and neighborhoods, provides opportunities for exercise that can counter today's trends in obesity and adult onset diabetes and, enhances emotional wellbeing.

In 2006, City Council adopted the Pathway and Sidewalk Prioritization Analysis and Process. This plan exemplifies our commitment to enhancing our infrastructure and creating links to compliment a healthy, active lifestyle.

#### Reducing Energy Costs/Clean Air

The shade and evapotranspiration provided by trees act as natural air conditioners to help keep both individual homes and cities cooler, reducing the amount of energy and cost needed to do this. Additionally, trees and vegetation improve air quality by removing pollutants and chemicals from the air. Urban areas have a higher concentration of these pollutants from traffic, boilers, generators, and other sources, and trees are a relatively inexpensive way to mitigate these pollutants.

In 2007, Novi's forestry division planted over 1,700 trees as a part of replacement initiative to enhance our green space. Our long-standing dedication to the environment has been acknowledged by the Arbor Day Foundation by receiving the Tree City USA award for the last 15 years.



## Creating Safer Neighborhoods

### The Benefits of Parks in Recreation in Novi



Strong evidence exists demonstrating the effectiveness of recreation programming in preventing "at-risk" youth from engaging in deviant behavior. The return on investment of such programs is substantial when it is related to the cost of staff support. The Novi Parks Department plays a key role in supporting this initiative by keeping people engaged and active in the community.

- In 2007, the Novi Parks Department introduced the FIREUP Fest to the community. Over 500 high-school students enjoyed live music, food, games and more. This event is planned to continue and improve in 2008.
- The Novi Parks Performing Arts program continually offers after-school programming for kids. Annually, over 300 children ages 3-18 participate in these programs that support self-esteem, growth and confidence.
- Participation numbers for youth sports and camp programs that encourage teamwork, sportsmanship, and exploration are over 4,000 annually.

At each month's Commission meeting, the Parks, Recreation and Forestry staff provides the Commission with a staff report on items of interest. These items reflect the mission of Novi Parks to:

Promoting a Healthy, Active Lifestyle

- Enhancing Economic Development
- Stewards of the Environment

- Creating Safer Neighborhoods
- Instilling a Sense of Community

#### Promoting Healthy, Active Lifestyles

The Michigan Mountain Bike Association has been a great partner to the department. We were able to negotiate Mountain Biking summer camp to be offered in Novi this summer.

During the month of January, 1,038 community members participated in Stretch and Strength, Body Recall, Pilates, Line Dance, Clogging and monthly dance with a live band at the Novi Senior Center.

Youth basketball (grades 4-6) and volleyball leagues (grades 1-2, 7 & 8) began in January. The coaches were provided a new skills manual to promote and teach new techniques for youth.

#### **Enhancing Economic Development**

A donation of original scenery, costumes and royalties for Father Bingo from 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Production was made to the Novi Theatres. This resulted in savings of over \$29,250.

The Friends of the Novi Theatres and the Novi Theatres hosted a Mardi Gras Celebration fundraiser which brought in approximately \$18,000. This will be used to enhance to theatre by purchasing new equipment, funding musicians, and upgrading existing equipment.

Over \$2,000 was raised to sponsor the Daddy Daughter Dances. The sponsorship benefits the local businesses by providing another avenue for targeted marketing.

The Senior Transportation program provides a safe, essential service for senior residents in our community. In January over 1000 rides were provided.

#### Stewards of the Environment No Report

**Creating Safer Neighborhoods** 

The Novi Theatres has started their new set of classes for adult and young people. Some examples are Stealing the Scene (a class for young developing actors), Salsa (a dance class for ages a variety of ages), and Stinky Cheese Players (a creative acting class for the very young). Through these and other offerings, the community is offered a safe and educational environment to come and learn with friends old friends and to create new friendships.

In the month of January, Novi Senior Center presented information workshops on "Community Resources", "Soups On", "Low Vision" and "Alcoholism and the Older Adult" all of which help keep seniors informed of current safety, nutrition and heath issues.

The Novi Senior Center hosted a Safety Fair for residents. Seven organizations participated in the events by bringing handouts, information and give always for the seniors.

The Novi Parks maintenance staff worked to keep the pathways and parking lots to municipal buildings clear and safe for our community members during the recent winter storms

Forestry staff spent several days making various neighborhoods safer by pruning trees that were obstructing vehicle/pedestrian roads/sidewalks.

#### Instilling a Sense of Community

The operations division completed the City Council Chambers renovations, making the environment more aesthetically pleasing and welcoming.

The Novi Theatres saw a tremendous turnout for auditions for the Father Bingo production. Actors who had not performed in many years returned to the theatre, as well as new actors from other community theatres. Novi was chosen to produce the community theatre world premiere of this musical and local actors and professional theatre are teaming up to make this a great show. Father Bingo premiers on March 7, 2008

For the month of January, 41 dedicated volunteers at Novi Senior Center and Civic Center worked 377 hours helping to implement and facilitate the many programs and events held for our seniors.

Our annual Super Saturday Polish Celebration in January was sold out to 128 residents who enjoyed a true Polish meal, enjoyed the musical entertainment of the Kielbasa Kings Polka Band and joined in dancing, singing and much conversation. This event rated a customer satisfaction rating of 4.89.

The department was able to display pertinent program and benefit information at the annual Homeowners Association Breakfast held on January 26. The event is attended by association leaders and the information they gather is then shared with their neighbors.
